



The official dress code for the Fargo Country Club

Golf Course attire:

Members and their guests are expected to present themselves in a professional manner while on the golf course and practice facilities. Shirts and shoes must be worn at all times. Men's shirts must have the appropriate collar and sleeves. Golf specific crews are acceptable. Golf shorts and pants must be worn. All men's golf apparel sold in the golf shop is acceptable. Men's shirts must remain tucked in.

Ladies dress code will match LPGA guidelines. Golf specific sleeveless and collarless shirts may be worn during play. Golf specific leggings sold in the golf shop are allowed. There is no specific length requirement on shorts or skirts. Athleisure wear is permitted on the golf course. Unacceptable attire while using the golf facilities includes thin strapped tank tops, halter tops, denim, cut-offs, sweatpants, gym shorts, and t-shirts.

Clubhouse attire:

Members and their guests are expected to present themselves in a professional manner while in the clubhouse. Shirts and shoes must be worn at all times. Denim jeans are permitted in the clubhouse and dining areas but must be free of rips, tears, tatters, or acid wash.

Gentleman may wear all golf approved clothing in the clubhouse. Business casual wear is preferred and shirts must remain tucked in. Ladies may wear all golf approved clothing in the clubhouse. Unacceptable attire while in the clubhouse includes thin strapped tank tops, halter tops, cut-offs, sweatpants, gym shorts, t-shirts and pajamas. All member teenagers will be asked to adhere to the same dress code standards as adults. Parents and guardians will be asked to make best efforts to have children 12 and under adhere to the dress code for adults.

Additional items:

- Hats will not be allowed in the dining room.
- Unaccompanied children 17 and under will not be allowed to dine without a parent or guardian in the 1898 lounge (our main bar) or Sports Bar.
- Children 17 and under will not be allowed to dine in the 1898 lounge on Wednesdays.
- Members out of dress code will be asked to move their party to the sports bar. If the Sports Bar is occupied, the party may be asked to leave and return dressed in proper attire.

All decisions made by managers on duty will be supported by upper management with the goal of equipping our team with the support necessary to carry out our vision of creating the best private club experience possible.
